Janet had a career high game of 289 and a high series of 658.

She was a WIBC and AWBA member for over 30 years. She was a member of the 500 Club and the 600 Club.

She helped set up a number of leagues and tournaments. Janet also served as President and Secretary/Treasurer of several leagues.
